## Appendix 7. Draft certificate display eligibility recommendations

## Scores on Doors' Pilot Evaluation Certificate Display Eligibility Recommendations

(To be read in conjunction with the 'Scores on Doors' General Guidelines document)

- 1. A 'Scores on Doors' grade will determined based on points accumulated from using the Food Premises Assessment Report and scoring system form.
- 2. A food business will not be eligible to receive nor display a grade, regardless of the final points score, if:
  - a. The 'authorised officer' issues an enforcement action through issuing an;
    - i. Improvement Notice, or;
    - ii. Penalty Notice, or;
    - iii. Prohibition Order, or;
    - iv. Seizure Notice, or;
    - v. Prosecution
- 3. A food business will not be eligible to receive nor display a grade, regardless of the final points score, if:
  - a. The 'authorised officer' assigns a 'critical' (breach score of 8)
- 4. A food business will not be eligible to receive nor display a grade, regardless of the final points score, if:
  - a. The inspection that is undertaken is only a 'part' inspection.
- 5. Those food businesses that are ineligible to receive or display a grade will not be allowed to receive or display a grade following closure of any enforcement action by council. These businesses must be subject to a complete unannounced re-inspection after closure or finalisation of any enforcement action. It is recommended that the re-inspection occurs within three (3) months.
- 6. Where a food business is inspected due to a complaint and the complaint is substantiated or proven, or the EHO becomes aware of a significant change in food safety standards, the food business will be deemed ineligible to display its current grade. The grade display must be removed. It is recommended that council conduct an unannounced inspection within three (3) months to re-determine the grade.
